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A NEW SET OF RAILS TO RUN ON

Alcohol took everything from me.

On October 10th 2006 I got my 5th DUI. In the drunken tank I thought to myself, "What's a nice guy like me doing in a place like this?" Words that I would soon read. I got home and fell to my knees and prayed "God please help me". My journey to sobriety began — although I drank that day, October 11th.

Ken H. who was 13 years sober knew me well (You know what I mean, as one alkie can recognize another). He told me, "There Is A Solution". Now these were more familiar words, ones I had heard before. (I had a brief stint of sobriety earlier in life). He took me to a meeting that night, the 12th of October.

We walked into a men's meeting. It was VERY smokey; you could cut the smoke with a chainsaw. Coffee?.... there was coffee alright... I bet a spoon would have stood straight up in it! There was no cream, no sugar.... this was a rough bunch, and they were sober and serious about Alcoholics Anonymous. Once again, I drank after the meeting.

I had previously made contact with another man to go to a 7:00 am meeting the next morning ,October 13th. I didn't want to go, but I wanted to quit drinking. Now I realize at that time I was at the "jumping off place".

I came to that AA meeting red faced and puffy, with pie eyes that looked like a road map: I was one grumpy, immature man.

I walked into that meeting and saw a bunch of ummmmm, well, ... AA people. One man was on oxygen, another obviously living on the streets, a guy who had a reputation as a fighter, a woman who glared at me (so I thought), and a blind girl.

Of course there were many others, and they all seemed to take note of me. (Me and my damn ego) I began to wonder what the H E double hockey sticks I am doing here. They were fond of saying "If you want what we have, be willing to go to any lengths", "keep coming back it works" --- I really wasn't sure I wanted what they had! I was doubtful this bunch could help! It was in that 7:00 am meeting I got sober.

A few days passed, and I began to feel better. I thought hmmm, "Maybe there is something to this AA." A few more days passed, and I discovered the pleasure of eating (my previous diet consisted of 5- \$1 burgers at a fast food chain every week for the last few years) and the rejuvenating feeling of a good nights sleep. I cannot describe how those two things meant so much to me; I was soon to learn that these things were just an inkling of what sobriety would give me.

I began to enjoy getting up in the morning. I learned to pray, I learned the 3rd step prayer, the 7th step prayer, the serenity prayer. I was learning to meditate (and still am). I was reading an AA approved piece of daily inspiration, I was reading pages 86, 87, and 88 of the Big Book. I discovered the 12 and 12. I looked in the mirror one morning and the thought "I DO NOT HATE MYSELF ANY-MORE" ran through my head.

I kept going to the 7:00 am meeting and the fog was starting to clear more and more. I could actually listen to what people were sharing, and process it in my brain. I was watching people get their families back, and their driver's licenses back, people were saying they were reacting differently to life situations, they even said things were getting better in their financial affairs — I wanted these things!

I got a sponsor; the man I mentioned who was on oxygen became my sponsor Jay R. I developed a relationship of trust with this man like I had never had before. He began to take me home after the meeting and we began working steps. THAT is when my life was "rocketed into the 4th dimension".

Instantaneously upon starting the steps, my life changed. I started to feel some balance with my spiritual, mental, physical and emotional states. My total surrender with complete abandon to my Higher Power and to the diligent disciplined practice of the 12 steps of Alcoholics Anonymous was working. My life was changing. I had a new set of "Rails To Run On".

John P. in that 7:00 am meeting loaned me money to purchase a bicycle. I didn't ask him, it just somehow happened. I began to ride my bicycle everyday to that 7:00 am meeting. One day riding to the meeting a car turned left in front of me and I ended up on the hood, bounced off the windshield and landed on the street. I heard the sounds of the sirens of police cars and ambulances as they arrived ... but not before the lady whom I mentioned was "glaring at me" in my first meeting. She bent over me and asked "Honey are you alright"? I felt the love of AA for the first time. Eleven more people from that 7:00 am meeting stopped. This changed me forever.

The "man obviously living on the streets" continued to relapse. I burst into tears one day at the end of the meeting while we were saying the Lord's Prayer over his inability to stay sober; I felt sadness. The "guy who had a reputation as a fighter" was taken by our disease; I felt remorse. The "blind girl" and I became friends, and I helped her in and out of the meeting nearly every day; I felt compassion. I was identifying my emotions.... The Next Frontier! I became one of those "well ummmmm AA people".

In true alcoholic form in my first year I decided to take a new job (here in Central Oregon), get into a new relationship, and move. I was truly worried that the sobriety in Central Oregon could not compare to what I had found in the valley.

I WAS WRONG.

I met "Eliza-bling" and "Doc" Charlie at my first meeting in Central Oregon at a noon meeting in Sunriver... I was instantly inspired and it was in that meeting I knew sobriety here was going to be beyond anything I could have ever hoped for. The same week I met Bruce L. and Sandy L. at an AA meeting; He just happened to be going to the 7:00 am daily at TEC.

I found my new home group. Maui John became my sponsor. I went through the steps with him vigorously and thoroughly -- there was no other way with Maui John, he said that method would produce "the maximum effect"it worked for me. I went through some major life changes. I promptly ran him out of town to Arizona: Bruce C. became and still is my sponsor. I have also worked the steps with him, and he has helped me to learn how to meditate and become a better man.

Monkey Monk Dan taught me to love those in my family as if they were newcomers. Leopard Shari taught me that sobriety is gift that it needs to be nurtured and protected. Gwen W. pointed me in the direction of a meeting instead of the bar.

I did get my family back. I went on a 9th step journey to Chicago and Texas in October of 2010. For financial reasons (my excuse) I tried to get out of going and I couldn't (I tried to get a refund on my plane tickets on a technicality; it didn't happen). Bruce C. chuckled and suggested that maybe it was Gods will I go.....he was right. My mother in Chicago and sister in Texas looked at me incredulously as I cleaned my side of the street. "I have never had it so good" Frankie B. drove me to the DMV and other places



and helped me get my driver's license back. I use the steps to help me react to challenging life situations now. (I am not always successful, as I DO have a COUPLE of character defects remaining). Fear of financial insecurity HAS left me.

There are no coincidences for me anymore.

I have for some reason developed a passion for the traditions and the history of Alcoholics Anonymous. Vera F. and Wisconsin Mike also share this passion, we meet to learn more and get deeper into this life of spirituality. I am learning the sky is the limit (and beyond) in Alcoholics Anonymous.

I love Alcoholics Anonymous and how it works. It HAS changed my life. I was told early on if I put Alcoholics Anonymous first in my life everything else after that would be first class.

"Now there is a sense of belonging, of being wanted and needed and loved. In return for a bottle and a hangover, we have been given the "Keys of the Kingdom".

Alcoholics Anonymous has given me everything.

The March 2012 Issue has Arrived!




