Are We Being All Inclusive Within our Service Structure?

I am a member of Alcoholics
Anonymous and I have had the privilege of
being of service in many capacities throughout
my sobriety. I would like to take this
opportunity to talk about how the "spirit" of
the Traditions has helped me over the years.
Not only in protecting our primary purpose in
Alcoholics Anonymous, but also in protecting
Alcoholics Anonymous from one or two

individuals who may try from time to time to play GOD. I have been a culprit of that myself, so I feel experienced enough to talk about this issue.

The most important thing I've learned recently has been that informed communication is so vital to our committee's and groups.

One of the many things the Intergroup in Central Oregon does is provide a way for sober alcoholics

to learn to have fun in sobriety through various committees as part of the service structure. Recently, we thought we had lost part of that structure. To many I've spoken with, it was like losing a limb. After an emergency meeting between the Intergroup Advisory Board and the Entertainment Committee, a spiritual solution was found using Tradition Two*

allowing the service structure of the Intergroup to become whole again.

[*Tradition Two: "For our group purpose there is but one ultimate authority—a loving God as He may express Himself in our group conscience. Our leaders are but trusted servants.]

We all rely on the Groups in Central Oregon to announce various upcoming events to ensure as many people as possible will be informed about the activities they may want to attend.

WE RISE BY

LIFTING

Over the past few years, I've noticed that some groups will not announce certain events due to the fact that it may not be sponsored by Alcoholics Anonymous. Along with another Alcoholic, I did some

research and found that

the General Service

Office's (GSO) Newsletter (Box 459) announces many functions that are happening throughout the country, i.e., Conferences, Conventions, Retreats, Roundups, etc. In addition, there is a document published by GSO entitled Guidelines for Conferences, Conventions, and Roundups.

I believe we have so much information available to us these days. Unfortunately, many of us aren't as informed as we think. We pass along what we know in each group and someone says "We've always done it this way" and might even go as far as pointing out which Tradition is behind it. When I started this story, I spoke about the spirit of the Traditions. I truly believe they are all spiritual and all inclusive.

We use the traditions to determine the correctness of our actions in making decisions in Alcoholics Anonymous. Unfortunately, sometimes, we use the precise wording of the Traditions to condemn ideas prior to understanding the spiritual nature of the idea. We all want Alcoholics Anonymous to survive and prosper by adhering to the Traditions. I feel that it is a spiritual action that all useful events and information is communicated to the entire fellowship. I'm hopeful that all Groups, Committees and fellow Alcoholics in service will look for the spirit of our Traditions and our Primary Purpose; one Alcoholic helping another Alcoholic so that we may both stay sober. Sharing how to enjoy life and have fun through these service committees is just one of the many spiritual actions we can pass along to one another.
