Bend Young People win bid for conference Young and Young-at-Heart

OSYPAA (Oregon State Young People in Alcoholic Anonymous) wins bid to host annual Young People's Conference here in Bend!

"OSYPAA Facts, Aims and Purposes

OSYPAA was created in 2011 by a group of young people in Eugene, OR. Roughly a year after hosting OSYPAA, the young people's committee was struggling to find a purpose. No longer acting as a bid committee for OSYPAA, the unity among YPAA's in the area had dwindled considerably. Looking to unify the area, and ultimately the entire state, the group then known as EASYPAA (Eugene and Springfield Young People in Alcoholic Anonymous) would vote to disband. They immediately reformed as the first ever OSYPAA host committee.

Oregon State Young People in Alcoholic Anonymous is a committee whose intent is to have a yearly conference in Oregon that will enrich and strengthen the young people's fellowship across the state.

OSYPAA's aim is to reach young people in sobriety and carry the message of AA's Twelve Steps while demonstrating that life as a young sober person is both exciting and worthwhile."



It is there for each and every one of us.



1. WE ADMITTED WE WERE POWERLESS OVER ALCOHOL-THAT OUR LIVES HAD BECOME UNMANAGEABLE.

If you continue your alcoholism, do you think it will continue to create more problems in your life?

Then why haven't you quit permanently?

Step One involves two parts:

a) admitting powerlessness

b) admitting that your life is unmanageable.

Although admitting these things is frightening, denying them won't bring you any closer to solving your problems.

Maybe you feel guilty or ashamed of your drinking, and you've isolated yourself from your friends and family. Perhaps your physical and mental health are suffering, or you're dealing with legal or financial consequences. Or maybe your spiritual health is suffering and you're behaving in ways that go against your values and morals. If you relate to any of these, your life has become unmanageable.

It's instinctual to resist the idea of powerlessness, but the more you try to exert your willpower to stop, the worse the alcoholism will become. Eventually, you're completely consumed by it to the point where you feel the compulsion to drink despite being aware of the consequences.

People who've struggled with alcoholism rarely recover without any resources. Self-reliance isn't useful in overcoming alcoholism, and admitting powerlessness and relying on outside help offers a way out. Surrendering means you're willing to become teachable.

2. CAME TO BELIEVE THAT A POWER GREATER THAN OURSELVES COULD RESTORE US TO SANITY.

The thought behind Step Two is that you can't cure your alcoholism on your own. There is something more significant than ego and self-discipline, and it lies within a Higher Power - however you choose to define that Higher Power.

Step Two is not an attempt to change someone's belief system.

Instead, it requires you to continue to surrender and be willing to try something new. An open mind, humility and faith in something bigger than yourself, whether that's God or the collective knowledge in your 12-Step group, can establish a foundation for you to keep working the steps.

3. MADE A DECISION TO TURN OUR WILL AND OUR LIVES OVER TO THE CARE OF GOD AS WE UNDERSTOOD HIM.

When you admit that you have a problem greater than yourself, you may start to realize you need a power greater than yourself to solve it.

A good way to get started on this step is by staying the Step Three prayer: "God, I offer myself to Thee - to build me and to do with me as Thou wilt. Relieve me of the bondage of self, that I may better do Thy will. Take away my difficulties, that victory over them may bear witness to those I would help of Thy Power, Thy Love, and Thy Way of life. May I do Thy will al-

ways!" (Big Book, page 63)

Your concept of a Higher Power doesn't need to be like anyone else's. By attending 12-Step meetings, you're already demonstrating the willingness to surrender and accept the guidance of the program. It shows you're willing to consider your ideas and recognize that some of the ideas from the 12-Step program may be better than your own.

How will your Higher Power give you the strength you need? You just have to be willing to let your Higher Power do it. As you adopt the principles into your life, you'll start to feel your Higher Power's presence grow stronger within you, and that's how you develop the strength to live a sober life.
