Principle of the Month

Membership/Identity

"The problem faced by this Tradition isn't just past A.A. history. It keeps coming up—for instance, when a group debates whether to exclude alcoholics who have problems

other than alcohol or have differing lifestyles. The Tradition mentions no such additional requirements, no demand that prospective members must not have a history

of drug abuse, a certain lifestyle, or an institutional background. All alcoholics are welcome. What about the group that seems to impose extra requirements, beyond "a desire to stop drinking"? This might be a "special interest" group or collection of groups in which, for example, each member must be a physician—or a young person, a man, a woman, a priest, or a law-enforcement officer. By their own account, those attending special interest groups

consider themselves A.A. members first. They attend general-membership meetings as well as those that fill their other individual needs, and they remain devoted to A.A.'s primary purpose. These "special interest" groups

offer only one instance of the diverse and inclusive membership within our Fellowship. Our Traditions allow unparalleled freedom, not only to every A.A. member, but to every A.A. group."

Hello Everyone! If you are interested in being of service and do not know what you want to do, here is a suggestion: The AA Hotline needs people. We have open slots on: Sunday 9 am to 2 pm and Wednesday 1 pm to 5 pm. Also, we need relief people for the hotline. The requirement is 6 months of continuous sobriety. AND we need people to do 12th Step calls. This is support to people who want to talk to someone. Mostly they are phone calls; sometimes it is an in person visit. If you do make a 12th Step visit, bring along another AA.* Men work with Men and Women work with Women. These areas have very few people or none signed up to do 12th Step calls. La PIne, Prineville, Sisters, Sunriver, Tumalo, and Warm Springs. The requirement is 1-year continuous sobriety. It is helping another alcoholic. 




Big Book Display from the 59th International Women's Conference in Dallas, TX in February 2023



Deschutes County Jail to Resume in person AA Meetings

Before Covid AA Members would conduct meetings once a week in the Deschutes County Adult Jail (DCAJ) and the Work Release Facilities. When Covid hit all meetings were stopped. Meetings resumed for the DCAJ online, AA members on tablets in the Work Release Facility online with inmates on tablets in the main jail.

The Sheriff's Dept has just announced that they are moving towards resuming in person meetings by accepting new volunteer applications and scheduling an orientation.

The District 5 website has not yet been updated with the new information and application, but you can email <u>correctionalfacilities@district5aa.org</u> for additional information. (email link can also be found on the District 5 Website). This is a very rewarding service opportunity. The deadline for submitting new applications is March 17.



District 5 would like to invite COIG to send in an intergroup report even if neither of the chairs are physically able to attend the district meeting. 


