"...I am an alcoholic.

I found an answer to frustration in the bottom of a shot glass and I was to pursue this course until I had wrecked my home and my civilian occupation, and was dismissed from the service of my country with a Bad Conduct Discharge. Why this condition existed I cannot pretend to explain, nor for my present purposes is it very important. I know from experience that alcoholism is no respecter of person and certainly not of position. It strikes with the same lack of discrimination displayed by cancer, and can be as fatal

I came to realize also that circumstances outside myself, neither people, geography, nor employment, had any bearing on a problem deep within me. This to a person unacquainted with alcoholic reasoning, or lack of it, would seem to be self-evident; to me it was a startling discovery and led to my first attempts at mature reasoning of a problem rather than its submergence in alcohol.

Space does not permit a detailing of the results obtained except to state that they have been successful beyond anything I thought possible.

On that day when I stood at the crossroad of decision contemplating the end of hope, and perhaps of life itself, I found that the end was really the beginning of life for me and the thing I had approached so hesitantly as being the last chance was actually the first chance I've ever had."

Honesty

The Merriam-Webster definitions: Honesty - Adherence to the facts. Honest - Genuine, real, humble, plain.

"The only requirement for membership is an **honest** desire to stop drinking." Foreword to First Edition, p.xiv

"Rarely have we seen a person fail who has thoroughly followed our path. Those who do not recover are people who cannot or will not completely give themselves to this simple program, usually men and women who are constitutionally incapable of being honest with themselves. There are such unfortunates. They are not at fault; they seem to have been born that way. They are naturally incapable of grasping and developing a manner of living which demands rigorous honesty. Step 1 Prayer

"Dear Lord, Help me to see and admit that I am powerless over my alcoholism. Help me to understand how my alcoholism has led to unmanageability in my life. Help me this day to understand the true meaning of powerlessness. Remove from me all denial of my alcoholism."

There Is a Salutian

Step One: "We admitted we were powerless over alcohol — that our lives had become unmanageable."

"We know that little good can come to any alcoholic who joins A.A. unless he has first accepted his devastating weakness and all its consequences. Until he so humbles himself, his sobriety — if any — will be precarious. Of real happiness he will find none at all. Proved beyond doubt by an immense experience, this is one of the facts of A.A. life. The principle that we shall find no enduring strength until we first admit complete defeat is the main taproot from which our whole Society has sprung and flowered."

Big Book Study:

A Study of the AA Basic Text (Some Groups also read the stories in the back)

Discussion Meeting:

A topic is read from A.A. Literature then members share on that topic (Usually a closed meeting)

Speaker Meeting:

One or more preselected A.A. members are invited to speak (Usually an open meeting)

Speaker / Discussion:

Half the meeting is a speaker, the other half is shares from the floor

Newcomer Meeting:

Topic is usually around a pamphlet or on steps One, Two or Three

Beginner Meeting:

Geared toward people new to AA offering basic information and often an opportunity for Q&A


Business Meeting:

Groups have a special monthly meeting for Home Group members to get together and organize the business of their group. This is also where members take part in their local intergroup, district, and AA as a whole.
