Democracy


Concept 5—Short Form "Throughout our world services structure, a traditional 'Right of Appeal' ought to prevail, thus assuring us that minority opinion will be heard and that petitions for the redress of personal grievances will be carefully considered. "

"This "Right of Appeal" recognizes that minorities frequently can be right; that even when they are in error they still perform a most valuable service when they compel a thorough-going debate on important issues. The well-heard minority, therefore, is our chief protection against an uninformed, misinformed, hasty or angry majority."

Step Five : "Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs."

"Certain distressing or humiliating memories, we tell ourselves, ought not be shared with anyone. These will remain our secret. Not a soul must ever know. We hope they'll go to the grave with us. Yet if A.A.'s experience means anything at all, this is not only unwise, but is actually a perilous resolve. Few muddled attitudes have caused us more trouble than holding back on Step Five."

"This brings us to the Fifth Step in the program of recovery mentioned in the preceding chapter. This is perhaps difficult — especially discussing our defects with another person. We think we have done well enough in admitting these things to ourselves. There is doubt about that. In actual practice, we usually find a solitary self-appraisal insufficient. Many of us thought it necessary to go much further. We will be more reconciled to discussing ourselves with another person when we see good reasons why we should do so. The best reason first: If we skip this vial step, we may not overcome drinking."

Each Alcoholics Anonymous group ought to be a spiritual entity Having but one primary purpose – that of carrying its message to the alcoholic who still suffers.


This Tradition is so beautiful. It removes the responsibility from us to *have* to help with other addictions within our groups. It gives us the responsibility of helping another alcoholic who still suffers.

"We think we should do one thing well rather than many things to which we are not called". "to carry our message to the alcoholic who still suffers. That is our basic objective, and our real reason for existence." Alcoholics Anonymous Comes Of Age, pp.161-162

I have not had a tragic experience myself with trying to help another addiction in my group, other than to suggest another group which may be more helpful to them. For that I am truly grateful. I do not know personally what to do or say to other addictions because I am only an alcoholic. That is quite enough for me, and it puts me in a perfect position to help another person suffering from Alcoholism. I have been there, suffered and, with the help of my God and AA, I have recovered. Even today I do not like it when other addictions are brought up in my home group. It makes me very uncomfortable because I cannot relate to what is being said; I do not want to relate either.

I go to AA so I can live in steps 10,11,12 and to help another alcoholic as I have been helped.






